## **COURSE ENROLLMENT INFORMATION – PLEASE READ CAREFULLY**

1. Summer College (SC) students may request to be enrolled in any combination of Core Courses and Second Summer Session courses as long as they register for a minimum of 6 but not more than 7 credits.
2. Do not schedule two courses that overlap or meet at the same time.
3. Core Courses will consist exclusively of SC students. Second Summer Session courses will consist of SC students and regularly matriculated students. It has been our experience that some Ivy League schools will not accept transfer credit for courses that were not open to enrollment for regularly matriculated college students. Therefore, if you plan on attending an Ivy League school, you may want to select courses offered in the Second Summer Session rather than Core Courses. There is another situation you should be aware of as well. Let's suppose you plan to be a Biology major at another institution and you take BISC 207 at UD this summer. There is a good chance the school you attend will still want you to take their BISC 207 equivalent course. The reason for this is that, generally, schools will want you to take all your major coursework at their institution so they can ensure you and other majors have had the exact same course content. Please consider this when you choose your courses.
4. We strongly suggest that you do NOT enroll in courses that might potentially conflict with AP credit you may receive.
5. SC Core courses and Second Summer Session courses are identified by the course title, such as CHEM 103, and the section number, such as -030. All SC Core Courses have a section number of -030, so the full course name for General Chemistry would be CHEM 103-030. Second Summer Session courses will have similar course title abbreviations. Section numbers will be in the format 9XX. The course information needed to schedule these courses will be listed on the Summer Sessions website, <http://www.udel.edu/summer>, beginning in March.
